2017 was a great year for Bikes for Kids!

By the end of this year we will have given away more than 21,000 bikes. We couldn't have done this without the support of our wonderful Bikes for Kids community.

Moving the "Wheelhouse" to 36 Plains Road was a good decision. Doubling the space to over 4,000 square feet has allowed us to increase the number of repair stands, store more bikes/parts, maintain a small office and host more volunteers, all while saving money and ultimately helping us to give more bikes to children.

Your monetary donations cover the cost of our much appreciated Wheelhouse and parts to refurbish bikes allowing our team of dedicated volunteers to do what they do best — work on bikes. Volunteers make necessary repairs, safety check and shine each bike before a bike is tagged (with green duct tape) ready to donate. Donations also pay for a new helmet given to each bike recipient and the pickup and delivery of donated bikes.

Thanks to our Sponsors and great weather our second Charity Ride held this Fall was a huge success. Upon completion of one of four rides, participants and volunteers were hosted to the "best lunch in town" and tours of the new Wheelhouse. A great time and some good exercise was had by all – while raising money for BFK.


Plenty of pizza and chips will be available at the Wheelhouse on the 19th. Hope to see you there.

2017 Charity Ride

Over 180 riders and volunteers came together to support and celebrate Bikes for Kids by participating in the 2nd Annual Charity Ride. It was a gorgeous day for a bike ride. With 4 routes to choose from, there was a ride for every ability.

There were two longer rides (55 or 27 miles) starting from the Bikes for Kids Wheelhouse in Essex rolling through some of the most beautiful sections of Connecticut's River Valley. Both rides had the same route to start - including the killer incline of Wig Hill in Chester and a much appreciated stop at the enthusiastically staffed Cedar Lake Break Station. From there riders split off winding through Haddam, Killingworth (with a 36 mile Break Station option), Westbrook, Clinton and back to the Wheelhouse.

Riders looking for shorter options tried a scenic 12 mile ride or the perfect introductory 3 mile ride. Both these rides also shared the same beginning route through picturesque downtown Essex. BFK President and ride leader, Dave Fowler, said, "It was an amazing sight - over 60 riders ranging in age from 4 to 70 rolling down Main Street on a Sunday morning!". Some headed back to the Essex Town Hall, while others continued on the very challenging 12 miler out River Road and through Deep River with a stop to hydrate and refuel at the Deep River Green Break Station.

All rides had team leaders and were supported by SAG vehicles clearly identified by the flashing safety lights (donated by Whelen Engineering). There were three Break Stations stocked with sweet/salty/healthy snacks and beverages. And at each Finish there were balloons and a rowdy crowd excited to congratulate and waive riders in. Back at the Wheelhouse an amazing after ride lunch was served, a Bike Rodeo staffed by local high schoolers was available and the Wheelhouse was open for tours.

Thanks to our generous sponsors, volunteers and riders, the camaraderie and spirit of a morning well spent for a great cause was contagious!


